Happy New Year to NPS Rangers and SF-88 Volunteers!


There was a lot of activity in December.

More Military Tours coming in January !


An Upcoming visit from Warren AFB on January 19th I did not know, but they are an ICBM site, dating back to the early 1960's.

"We've had some progress with a few short-term maintenance goals for the site!

1. After inspections from our safety officer and the park electricians/maintenance, the Warhead Building has been deemed safe for staff, volunteers, and visitors. In addition, a safety inspection of Nike has been scheduled for early January.

2. The removal of the deteriorated Army Vehicle behind the Warhead Building has been approved by our Archivist and Supervisory Park Ranger James Grof. In late December the vehicle was inspected and approved for removal in early 2024! Hopefully the removal of the vehicle will also happen in January 2024.

3. The Generator Building was cleaned in time for the Sandia Group's visit to the Nike Site. Improvements to exhibit photographs and interpretive displays is next!

4. The junk pile has been removed from behind the flammable storage Building S972 We appreciate your efforts to keep SF-88 Running well and Safely. **Meet Katie Keeshen – Our New Seasonal Ranger at SF-88**!
